
Alexandra Class - Year 4

We continued our Term 1 and 2 topic of Invaders and Settlers by exploring the Vikings. We began the term by finishing off our art project on a portrait of Alfred the Great, using crosshatching to add detail and depth. So far in the Vikings, we have learnt all about their jobs, food, writing, stories, warriors, invasion of England and how they made it all possible- the infamous longboats. In our writing, we have done some beautiful narrative work by writing our own chapter of the book 'Viking Boy' by Tony Bradman, which we have continued to read every day as a class. Through art, history and geography, we have learnt a lot about the Viking influence on our world. We have also had a lot of fun exploring types and changes



of materials in Science with a lot of investigations involving melting, dissolving and separating. There has been some great work, big smiles and lots of cracking questions in all our topics this term!

Lydford Class - Year 6



Lydford class have composed and notated beautiful pentatonic compositions which they performed to Y1 over Teams. This is an outstanding achievement! They have written, self-edited and published Adventure stories about lost children in the rainforest – the quality of Lydford's writing has improved beyond what any of us imagined – the teaching team are SO proud of them. They have exercised (up to 2 minutes on our continuous runs now...), learnt

to play netball, printed beautiful Mayan patterns, created a Mayan village, started constructing Mayan masks, investigated light in a deep, dark, cupboard and completed a HUGE fraction unit in maths. December will be filled with the creation of our Chocolate Companies with a Dragon's Den style presentation to finalise our Mayan work. A fabulous month with plenty more learning and exercise to come!
